Brownkiss Peer- Indo-Caribbean populations

The Alliance for South Asian AIDS Prevention (ASAAP) is a non-profit, charitable organization committed to providing HIV related health promotion, support, education and advocacy for South Asian communities in the Greater Toronto Area.

ASAAP is seeking a Brownkiss peer (Indo Caribbean populations focus) to fill an exciting new role targeting and developing tailored outreach for Indo-Caribbean identified women. This position reports to the Women's Sexual Health Coordinator.

Contract term: 2 hours per week at \$15.00/hour from January 2017 to June 2017. Some weekend and evening work may apply/ flexibility required. Peers are paid a monthly honorarium for this position.

Responsibilities:

- Work with Indo-Caribbean women living with and at risk of HIV/AIDS to develop and facilitate the creation of support spaces
- Identify gaps with relation to services for Indo-Caribbean women using participatory approaches
- Build relevant networks and partnerships to promote and further the program and the agency
- Develop health messages relevant to women and identify appropriate channels for communication
- Maintain and be accountable for internal and external project reporting
- Assist with agency-wide activities and other duties as assigned by the Women's Sexual Health Coordinator and the Executive Director

Qualifications and Required Skills:

- Degree, diploma or certificate in the social sciences field or an equivalent combination of education and experience
- Extensive knowledge of issues relating to sexual and reproductive health for women of colour, specifically Indo Caribbean women
- Excellent public speaking and group facilitation skills
- Ability to build meaningful partnerships across diverse sectors
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills
- Demonstrated ability to exercise sound judgment, discretion, and tact
- Demonstrated ability to take initiative and develop creative programming
- Ability to speak one or more South Asian language(s) is an asset
- Commitment to social justice and anti-oppression
- Knowledge of MS Office, Outlook and Web technology
