ASAAP is seeking a part-time Peer Educator to support its Women's Sexual Health and Prevention Project to increase service access for Indo Caribbean women. This project is funded by Toronto Public Health's Toronto Urban Health Fund (TUHF).

Contract term: 15 hours per week at 15.00 per hour ending June 30, 2020. Some weekend and evening work will apply. Enrollment into group benefits plan is available to eligible successful applicants.

- Conduct HIV education and outreach to increase service access to women within the Indo Caribbean community at diverse community settings including bathhouses, bars and community-based events
- Develop and participate actively in a Project Advisory Committee
- Work collaboratively with ASAAP's Prevention Education team
- Network with other Non-Profit Organizations (NPOs) serving South Asian and or Indo Caribbean populations in Toronto
- Engage project volunteers in initiatives
- Support data recording and evaluation and writing of project reports
- Assist with agency-wide activities and other duties assigned by the Executive Director
